(Luke 16:1-13)</p> <p>As a family, think of all the gifts (talents) you have. Make a list and thank God for them.</p>	<p><b>16</b> Memorize St. Nerses Shnorhali's prayer: "Jesus, Wisdom of the Father, grant me wisdom, that I may always think, speak and do that which is good in your sight. Save me from evil thoughts, words, and deeds and have mercy upon all your creatures and upon me, a great sinner."</p>	<p><b>17</b> Look up Matthew 14:23, Mark 6:16, Luke 6:12, Mark 1:35, Luke 5:16. What was Jesus doing?</p>	<p><b>18</b> <i>Median Day of Lent</i> Take stock of your Lenten experience so far. Pray for the church.</p>	<p><b>19</b> Watch the news on TV today or skim the first few pages of the newspaper. Identify the people and places that need our prayers.</p>	<p><b>20</b> Google one of our great prayer writers, St. Nerses Shnorhali, and learn about him. Memorize one of the 24 prayers of <i>I Confess with Faith</i>. (Choose one other than "Jesus, Wisdom of the Father.")</p>	<p><b>21</b> <i>Forty Martyrs of Sebastea</i> These brave Christian soldiers in the 4th century Roman Army were thrown into a freezing lake because of their outlawed faith. One soldier could not take the cold and ran out. The 39 were found dead the next morning but with brilliant halos over their heads, the sight of which inspired a pagan guard to convert and throw himself to his death into the freezing water. Pray for Christians throughout the world who have sacrificed their lives for their faith. Find out where such things are happening.</p>

**From Today's Readings**

**Luke 16: 1** See below for the Parable of the Steward (1-13). Today's reading also includes the renowned story of the unnamed rich man and Lazarus. The rich man ignores the poor and ailing Lazarus and after both have died, he sees that Lazarus is in heaven at Abraham's side. Lamenting his own torment far from God, he asks that Lazarus be sent to warn his brothers of what can happen when they live selfish lives. Abraham tells him they had already been well informed by the Law and the prophets so nothing more would help. *Discuss/reflect: Like the unnamed rich man, do you want more assurances that God's ways are the best? What's keeping you from deeper faith, a faith that can lead to the richest life, now and eternally?*

**Ephesians 4:17-5:14** St. Paul notes that 'children of light' must set aside past behaviors, having become renewed in Christ and created to be like God in true holiness (vv.23-24). The way of love excludes all the vices we might have once considered acceptable. *Discuss/reflect: What specific ways does St. Paul cite as examples of "new self" behavior? (4:25-5:7) Of those listed, what one behavior do you need to change? Pray for God's help.*

**Isaiah 56:1-57:21** God's message is simple: "do what is right!" (56:1) He exhorts His people to remove the obstacles that keep people from Him and to be faithful to His covenant and honor the Sabbath, welcoming all who do the same. *Discuss/reflect: "When you cry out for help, let your collection of idols save you!" (57:13) Hmmm... What are the "idols" you rely upon for satisfaction and security, things that keep you from despair? What is God telling you about these?*

**Today is the Sunday of the Steward**




Stewards oversaw the finances and all the affairs of the house for wealthy families of ancient times. The steward in this parable (often also called the "shrewd manager") is far-sighted about his own welfare. When his master accuses him of wasteful ways, demanding an accounting and threatening his dismissal, the steward reduces the debts owed to his master by others so that they might employ him should it come to that (he was actually lowering his own built-in commission in every negotiation). He is commended by the master. Although a challenging parable, it is easier to understand when we see that Jesus is asking us to be as

diligent and ambitious about our spiritual welfare as we are about our worldly security. *Reflection: How committed are you to putting your spiritual house in good order? Is it as important as other matters? Why or why not?*
